
Meet today's typical Millennial

- (1) Like most Millennials, she would prefer to live in a socialist country -- and, like 47% of American adults overall, is likely to vote for a socialist.
- (2) She may be among the 36% of Millennials who approve of communism (up from 28% in 2018).
- (3) Like 43% of Millennials, she thinks The Communist Manifesto better "guarantees freedom and equality" than the U.S. Declaration of Independence, or she isn't sure.
- (4) Like 53% of Millennials, she believes America's economic system works against her.
- (5) Like 83% of U.S. college graduates, she doesn't know the difference between the free market and a government-dictated economy.
- (6) Like 73% of Millennials, she believes government should provide universal health care; like 67%, she believes it should provide tuition-free college.
- (7) Like 48% of Millennials, she believes the government should provide jobs to those who want to work, but can't find jobs.

- (8) Like 64% of American adults overall, she agrees with the phrase, "From each according to his ability, to each according to his need" and, like 69%, she either thinks it's in the U.S. Constitution, or doesn't know if it is or isn't.
 - (9) Like half of America's adults, she doesn't know the basic purpose of the Constitution, and can't identify even one of her rights under it.
 - (10) Like 80% of Millennials, she's unaware that at least 100 million people were murdered by socialist regimes in the 20th century; like 42%, she's never heard of Mao Tsetung.
 - (11) Like most American adults, she's unfamiliar with basic economic principles, financial and taxation facts, or harbors egregiously inverse perceptions of them.
- (12) Like half of U.S. adults, she can't read above the 8th-grade level. And like most Millennials, she has difficulty performing complex but common literacy tasks, such as understanding the arguments in a newspaper editorial, and comparing the cost-per-ounce of food.
